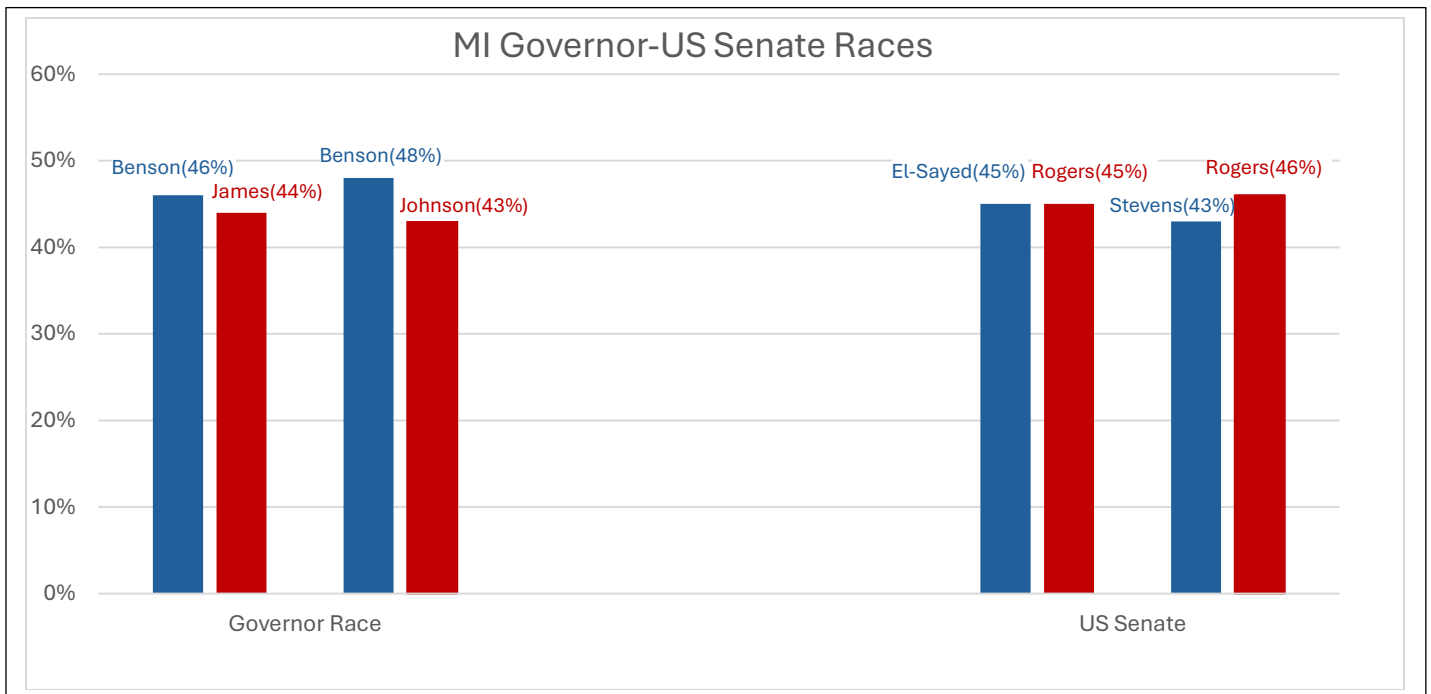

El-Sayed and Rogers Tied Benson Lead Cut to 2% vs James

LANSING, Mich. — Democrat Abdul El-Sayed, the likely Democratic nominee who is a progressive candidate endorsed by US Senator Bernie Sanders (I-Vermont) and US Representative Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-NY), is now tied at 45% with former Michigan Congressman Mike Rogers in the race for the United States Senate in Michigan. This recent polling shows a drop in support for El-Sayed since a June 11-13 poll by Mitchell Research which showed El-Sayed leading by five percent (47%-42%). In the race for governor, Michigan Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson's lead over Congressman John James, the likely GOP nominee, has also dropped to only two percent (46%-44%), according to a statewide poll of N=672 likely voters in the November General Election conducted by **Mitchell Research & Communications, Inc.**, July 28-29, 2026. The survey has a margin of error of + or – 3.77% at the 95% level of confidence.

Extensive polling shows John James/Jocelyn Benson and Abdul El-Sayed/Mike Rogers as the likely winners in their respective primaries, so the following analysis will focus on polling in those races in preparation for the upcoming general election, as opposed to the August primaries.

US Senate Race

In terms of the US Senate race, El-Sayed's support has decreased since the June 11-13 survey.

As we indicated earlier, the next part of this analysis will deal with the putative nominees, Rogers and El-Sayed.

Party Affiliation

- The reason El-Sayed is doing better against Rogers than Stevens is because El-Sayed (85%) has done a better job with Democrats than Stevens (77%).
- Rogers (91%-4%) has consolidated the Republican vote better than El-Sayed has consolidated the Democratic vote (85%-5%).
- Independents are divided almost equally, with Rogers leading by one percent (43%-42%).

Gender

- Once again, we are seeing the classic gender split. Among men, Rogers leads (53%-40%) while among women, El-Sayed leads (49%-38%).

Age

- El-Sayed has a strong lead among younger voters. He leads with 18-29 year olds (60%-28%) and 30-44 year olds (50%-24%). However, Rogers is strongest with voters older than 45. He has the lead with 45-64 year olds (50%-43%) and with those 65+ (55%-38%).

Race

- Rogers has a slight 8% lead with white voters (49%-41%), but El-Sayed has a huge 53% lead (84%-16%) among African American voters. Among those who marked their race as "Other" Rogers leads (48%-47%).

Governor Race

In the race for governor, Benson continues to lead both remaining GOP candidates, John James and Perry Johnson.

As we indicated earlier, the next part of this analysis will deal with the putative nominees, Benson and James.

Party Affiliation

- Both Benson (90%-4%) and James (90%-3%) have consolidated their respective party bases.

- Just as Rogers and El-Sayed were virtually tied with independents, so are James (40%) and Benson (39%).

Gender

- Once again, we are seeing the classic gender split. Among men, James leads (53%-39%) while among women, Benson leads (51%-36%).

Age

- The age demographics are considerably different in the governor's race than in the US Senate race. Benson leads with the three youngest age groupings, but her lead is not nearly as large as El-Sayed's lead was with 18-44 year olds.
- Benson leads with 18-29 year olds (48%-43%), with 30-44 year olds (48%-34%), and with 45-64 year olds (47%-45%). However James leads with voters age 65 and over (48%-42%).

Race

- James leads with white voters (46-44%) and El-Sayed leads among African American voters (59%-24%). Among those who marked their race as "Other" James leads (51%-42%).

Other Highlights

Voter Enthusiasm

- Only half (50%) of the Voters say that they are "very enthusiastic" about the upcoming elections. Democrats (55%) have a slight lead over Republicans (53%) in saying they are "very enthusiastic."

Top Issue

- The two top issues "that will have the most impact on [respondents] vote for governor and US Senator" were "Democracy, constitutional rights, and government accountability" (32%) and "Inflation/cost of living" (23%), and connected to that, another 7% said jobs and the economy.

Generic Ballot Questions

- In the Generic Ballot Questions, where you ask respondents if they will be voting for the Democrat or Republican in their Congressional district or State House district, for the third consecutive poll, we see a drop in support for Democrats. In the latest poll Democrats lead in the Congressional question by six percent (51%-45%), and in the State House (49%-46%).

Secretary of State/Attorney General

- In the race for secretary of state, Democrat Lt. Governor Garlin Gilchrist (45%) has a five percent lead over Republican Macomb County Clerk Anthony Forlini (40%).
- In the race for attorney general Republican Eaton County Prosecuting Attorney Doug Lloyd (43%) has an even narrower lead over Democrat Washtenaw County Prosecuting Attorney Eli Savit.

Methodology

The poll was conducted July 28-29, 2026, by text messaging a randomly selected list of registered voter's cell phones and directing them to a SurveyMonkey poll (MMS-Web) and online.

The poll of (N=672 Likely Voters) has a Margin of Error of + or – 3.77% at the 95% level of confidence. It is important to remember that subsets based on demographics, such as gender, age, education, and race/ethnicity, carry with them higher credibility intervals, as the sample size is reduced. Survey results should be understood within the poll's range of scores and know with a confidence interval of 95% a poll will fall outside the range of scores 1 in 20 times. Data is weighted by age, gender, race, area, education and previous election results to resemble likely voter turnout in November.

Mitchell Research was ranked 13th most accurate pollster of 136 polling companies who polled in 2024 by ActiVote. It received a higher ranking than all Michigan based pollsters and higher than the New York Times, Washington Post, ABC News, CNN, Quinnipiac, and YouGov.
